Braun's talks are rooted in authentic, firsthand lessons learned through successes and struggles in building pioneering companies with acclaimed leaders at the frontline of industry innovation. The White House, Stanford University, Harvard Business School, Fortune 500 companies and industry associations have featured Braun as a guest speaker. His book, "The Promise of a Pencil: How an Ordinary Person Can Create Extraordinary Change," is an international bestseller that reached the No. 1 spot on the What Corporate America Is Reading list. Business Insider named him to their 40 Under 40 list, and Wired identified him as one of its 50 People Who Will Change the World. Braun received the Tribeca Disruptive Innovation Award and the United States' most-prestigious award for public service, the Jefferson Award.

Holly Crowell is the quality improvement/infection prevention manager at Montgomery County Hospital and Clinics in Red Oak. Crowell has worked in quality for 35 years and in infection prevention for 25 years. She's a registered nurse and a certified professional in health care quality.

Clare Kelly is the chief government and external affairs officer at the Iowa Hospital Association. Before joining IHA, she was a health policy adviser to Gov. Kim Reynolds. Before her state service, Kelly was executive vice president and CEO of the Iowa Medical Society and was also executive director of government and external affairs for Children's National Hospital in Washington, D.C. She's a native of Fort Dodge and received her bachelor's degree in English and political science from the University of Iowa.

Andrew McCrea is a farmer, rancher, author and nationally syndicated radio and TV broadcaster. McCrea's traveled the nation producing "American Countryside," heard on radio stations coast-to-coast.
