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Telehealth payment reimbursement meeting scheduled with Wellmark

Wellmark has developed conceptional payment methodology and implementation/measuring criteria for providers of telehealth. To ensure members are fully educated on the concept, IHA is scheduling an all-membership call for **9:30 am Tuesday, Jan. 19**. Wellmark representatives will present the payment methodology and members will have the opportunity to offer their thoughts.

Throughout the pandemic, hospitals have relied on telehealth as a safe platform to provide and

maintain patient care. With member input, IHA has been advocating strongly for telehealth payment parity to maintain and advance this vital service. Besides developing potential payment criteria, Wellmark is extending payment parity for virtual services until at least June 30.

Gov. Reynolds outlines 2021 legislative priorities in address

Tuesday night, Gov. Kim Reynolds presented her annual condition of the state address in the Iowa House chamber. The governor began her remarks by showing gratitude to health care workers.

"In 2020, you worked some of the longest hours, in the most uncertain conditions," Gov. Reynolds said. "Your actions saved lives. Your spirit inspired us."

She also highlighted several of IHA's key priorities including:

- Emergency medical services.
- Mental health funding.
- Telehealth.

Additionally, she covered other issues important to hospitals such as Future Ready Iowa and broadband internet. IHA appreciates the governor's recognition of the importance of health care in Iowa and looks forward to working with her on these initiatives. IHA releases latest hospital data trends

IHA has collected Iowa hospital data trends for the COVID-19 pandemic period of March-November 2020 as compared with the same months in 2019. For this report, 92 Iowa hospitals reported data:

- Acute discharges decreased 13.3% as acute patient days decreased 5.3%.
- Ambulatory surgery visits (hospital-based) decreased 19.1%.
- Average length of stay increased 9.3%.
- Births decreased 6.9%.
- Charity care decreased 12.2%.
- Emergency department visits decreased 20.7%.
- Facility employment (excluding physicians) has decreased 4.1%.
- Inpatient admissions from the emergency department decreased 7.7%.
- Inpatient surgeries decreased 22%.
- Medicaid acute discharges decreased 11.5% and Medicaid acute patient days decreased 6.6%.
- Net patient revenue (collected charges) decreased 5.1%.
- Outpatient utilization decreased 8.7%.
- Total expenses have increased 2.2%.
- Uncompensated care (bad debts) decreased 17.3%.
