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Iowa Medicaid clarifies hospital readmissions policy

The Iowa Department of Health and Human Services and Iowa Medicaid released an informational letter providing clarity for [inpatient readmissions within 30 days for the same condition](#).

In 2015, informational letter 1585 said Iowa Medicaid would begin combining original claims with claims for readmission that occurred within seven days of discharge. Before the change, hospitals received two full diagnosis-related group payments for the separate admissions.

After the 2015 change, the additional net reimbursement for the adjusted hospital claim is zero but, in some instances, combining both claims saw a day outlier or cost outlier payment beyond the original payment.

Iowa Medicaid clarified:

- Review for admission should be based on the DRG and not diagnosis codes.
- Per diem information should be used in identifying readmissions instead of relying on diagnosis codes.
- Claims should be combined by the provider before submitting to managed care organizations.
