IHA advocacy team weekly round up

The comment period is open for the psychiatric intensive care reimbursement rate. The IHA advocacy team attended lowa Health and Human Services work group meetings where the reimbursement rate was set. <u>Email Jamie Horbach</u> at IHA for more information about submitting comments.

IHA releases latest hospital data trends

IHA had collected data trends from <u>100 hospitals for January-August 2022</u> as compared with the same time frame in 2021:

- Acute discharges decreased 2% as acute patient days increased 3.8%.
- Hospital-based ambulatory surgery visits increased 3.4%.
- Average facility paid hours increased 8.9%.
- Average length of stay increased 6.1%.
- Average physician paid hours increased 21.3%.
- Births increased 4.7%.
- Charity care decreased 8.9%.
- Emergency department visits increased 5%.
- Facility employment (excluding physicians) increased 8.9%.
- Inpatient admissions from the emergency department decreased 1.7%.
- Inpatient surgeries decreased 16.9%.
- Medicaid acute discharges decreased 5% and Medicaid acute patient days increased 1.8%

- Net patient revenue (collected charges) increased 4.3%.
- Outpatient utilization increased 9.7%.
- Payroll and benefits expense increased 12.2%.
- Total average paid hours increased 12.2%.
- Total expenses increased 7.6%.
- Uncompensated care (bad debts) increased 17.7%.
