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COVID-19 tele-tracking to transition from IDPH to HHS Feb. 19

The Iowa Department of Public Health will no longer report COVID-19 data to the Department of Health and Human Services on behalf of Iowa hospitals for Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services compliance after Feb. 18. This is due to the [state proclamation of disaster emergency expiring](#) Tuesday, Feb. 15.

Starting Feb. 19, hospitals will be required to submit data directly to HHS through the COVID-19 Tele-tracking portal. To get an account and users set up with HHS Tele-tracking:

- **Call technical support at 877-570-6309.** Live agents are available from 6 a.m.-6 p.m. Callers after 6 p.m. should leave a voicemail and will receive a call back.
- **Email HHS Tele-tracking at hhs-protect@teletracking.com.**

When contacting HHS for the first time, primary users should request to be labeled as the primary owner for the hospital. The primary owner designation will allow them to assign more users from the hospital and manage the hospital's account and contacts in the future. If users email HHS Tele-tracking to request access, they must provide the hospital user contact information and hospital name for access.

For ease of reporting, hospitals can request an API feed directly with HHS Tele-tracking. API requests must be sent through the email above, not the technical

support telephone number.

HHS said access requests are generally created the same day as the request. IDPH requested training webinars and additional resources and will notify Iowa hospitals when they are available.

U.S. House votes to fund government through March 11, goes to Senate

The U.S. House of Representatives voted 272-162 to pass a [continuing resolution](#) to fund federal programs through March 11. The continuing resolution would prevent a government shutdown when the current continuing resolution expires Feb. 18.

The legislation would extend through March 11 the current federal medical assistance percentage for certain territories among other provisions. The Senate could consider the continuing resolution soon.

Congress continues to negotiate overall funding levels for an omnibus funding bill for the rest of fiscal year 2022.

LockBit 2.0 ransomware potential threat to hospitals

The Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Department of Health and Human Services issued an alert to hospitals about a potential ransomware threat. HHS said the ransomware group LockBit poses significant cyberthreats to the health care industry, despite the group's claims it does not attack health care organizations.

The FBI said ransomware LockBit 2.0 uses purchased access, unpatched vulnerabilities, insider access and zero-day exploits. Health care organizations are encouraged to reduce the possibility of these attacks by using:

- A strong data backup program.
- Multifactor authentication.
- Strong passwords.
- The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency's [cyber-hygiene services](#).
- The [FBI's indicators of compromise](#) in their threat detection programs.

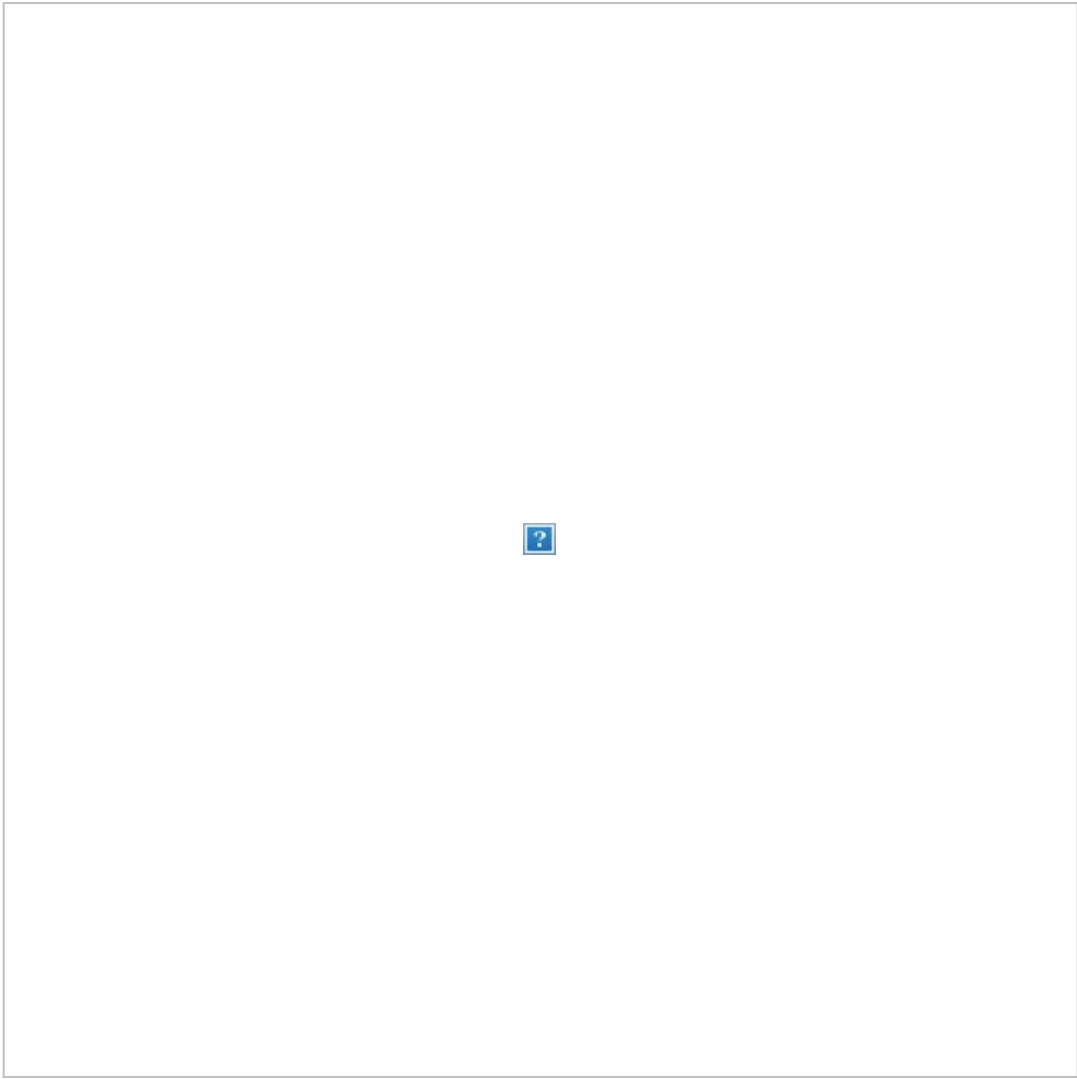
Thank you to our hospital advocates

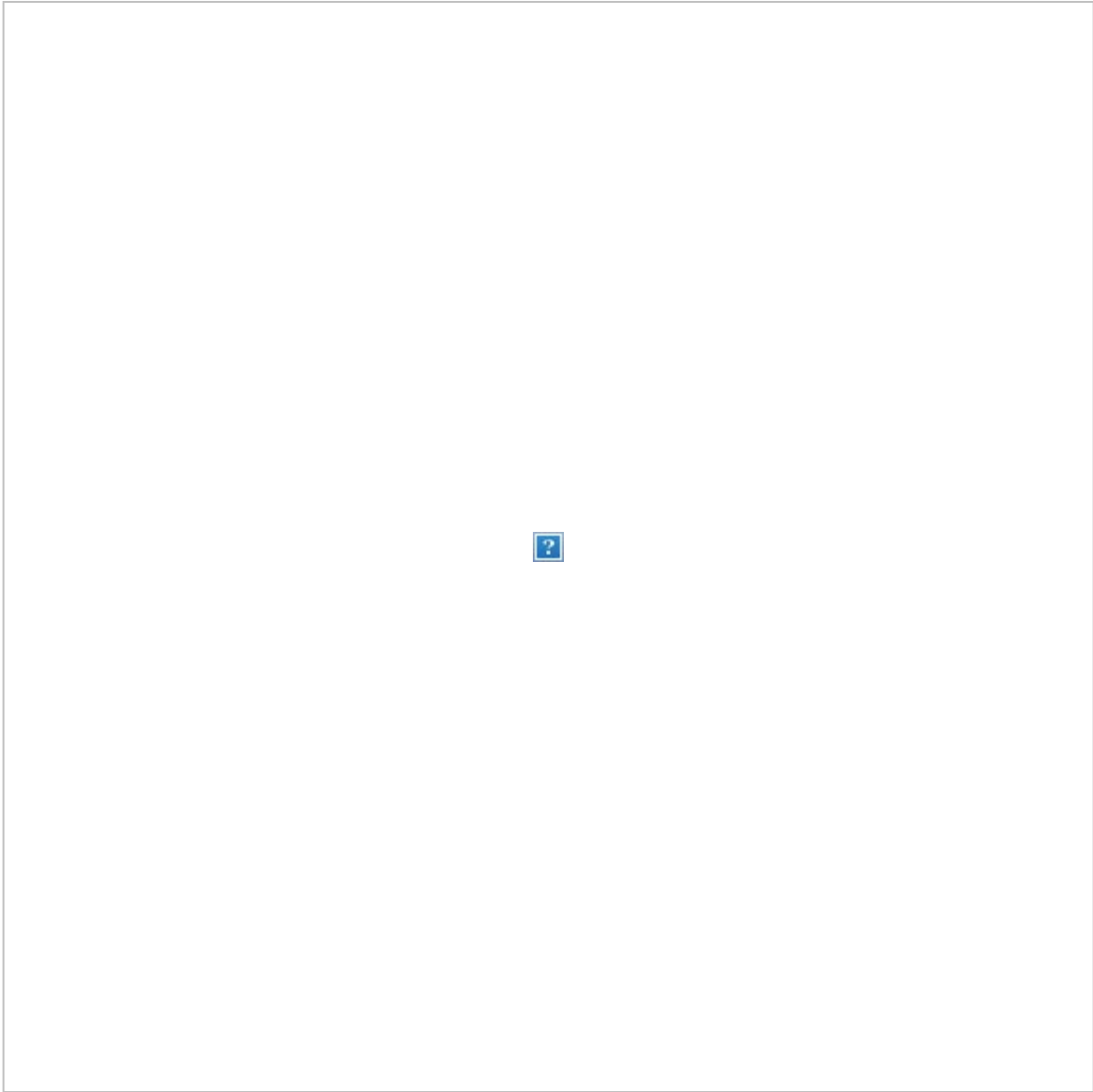
