COVID-19 public health emergency extended

President Joe Biden extended the designation of COVID-19 as a national emergency. The national public emergency was set to expire April 16. The Department of Health and Human Services said it will give 60 days' notice before termination or expiration of the public health emergency.

Although Iowa's state-declared emergency ended Feb. 15, Iowa still must follow federal guidelines in place including honoring federal waivers.

IHA releases latest hospital data trends

IHA has collected data trends from 99 Iowa hospitals for [January-February 2022](#) as compared with the same time frame in 2021:

- Acute discharges increased 1% as acute patient days increased 9.6%.
- Ambulatory surgery visits (hospital based) decreased 9.5%.
- Average length of stay increased 7.7%.
- Births increased 2.4%.
- Charity care decreased 18.8%.
- Emergency Department visits decreased 1.2%.
- Facility employment (excluding physicians) increased 13.1%.
- Inpatient admissions from the emergency department increased 2.6%.
- Inpatient surgeries decreased 11.3%.
- Medicaid acute discharges decreased 0.9% and Medicaid acute patient days increased 6.1%.
- Net patient revenue (collected charges) increased 6.6%.
- Outpatient utilization increased 18.4%.
- Total expenses increased 12%.
- Uncompensated care (bad debts) increased 30.8%.

The CDC created a survey to better understand infection control practices used by Iowa front-line health care workers. Using the survey results, Project Firstline will design new content so health care workers can understand and confidently apply infection control principles and protocols.
