\$2.45 million awarded for apprenticeship grant program

Gov. Kim Reynolds announced [eight recipients of the Iowa Health Careers Registered Apprenticeship Grant program](#). The program is based on the nursing and patient care program at the Career Academy of Pella and will provide high school students the opportunity to learn about health care careers while gaining real-world work experience with local nursing facilities and hospitals.

Gov. Reynolds spoke about the apprenticeship program in her State of the State address in January, and IHA has advocated for more programs and funding to support a health care workforce pipeline for Iowa's hospitals.

[The \\$2.45 million will serve 22 school districts](#) to support an estimated 450 apprentices. Awardees and partner school districts include:

Federal funds through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 were used for the grants. More information will be available in the future about the programs.

Negative hospital margins and labor challenges highlighted in report

U.S. hospitals and health systems continue to face difficult financial and operational

challenges in May according to the [latest report by Kaufman Hall](#). The report is based on data from more than 900 hospitals.

The report noted margins are “cumulatively negative” with hospitals continuing to perform below pre-pandemic levels. The report also noted some metrics normalized, but the outlook for the remainder of 2022 is uncertain.

Hospitals continue to see higher labor costs, fewer hours worked because of turnover and inflation, and long-standing labor shortages.

COVID-19 therapeutics ordering cadence revised for July 4 holiday

The Iowa Department of Public Health notified providers about an [updated COVID-19 therapeutics ordering cadence](#) around the July 4 holiday.

The revised dates are:

- Tuesday, July 5 – Allocation surveys will be sent.
- Wednesday, July 6 – Return allocation surveys to IDPH by 4 p.m.
- Thursday, July 7 – Allocations will be ordered in the federal system.
- Thursday, July 7 – IDPH will notify health care providers about allocation amounts.

The reporting cadence for the week of July 4 will remain the same. Internet Explorer is no longer supported for reporting. Chrome, Firefox, Edge or Safari should be used.
