CMS releases new COPs for rural emergency hospitals

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services released a [proposed rule creating the conditions of participation](#) for rural emergency hospitals and updating some requirements for critical access hospitals.

CMS proposed standards for the rural emergency hospital designation based largely on the critical access hospital conditions of participation and outpatient services' requirements where appropriate. CMS is seeking comment from rural communities about specific proposed rural emergency hospital standards, including the ability of a rural emergency hospital to provide low-risk labor and delivery services and the minimum qualifications for professionals who will provide on-call emergency services. **Comments about the proposed rule are due Monday, Aug. 29.**

Provisions about payment, quality measurement, program designation and enrollment is expected to be included in the 2023 outpatient prospective payment system proposed rule.

CMS also proposed [updates to the conditions of participation for critical access hospitals](#) by:

- Adding a definition of primary roads to the location and distance requirements.
- Allowing critical access hospitals that are a part of a health system with more than one hospital to meet the conditions of participation by using the health system's infection control and antibiotic stewardship programs, medical staff and quality assessment and performance improvement programs.
- Creating a patient's rights for conditions of participation.

IHA worked with Sen. Chuck Grassley to introduce legislation creating the rural emergency hospital designation and supports CMS' efforts to help rural health care facilities.
