No Surprises Act final rule released

The departments of Health and Human Services, Labor and the Treasury issued the No Surprises Act final rule updating several key regulations. Updates include clarifying information certified independent dispute-resolution entities must consider when making a payment determination under the federal arbitration process.

The changes conform with rulings made in February and July by the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Texas. The rulings vacated the part of the interim final regulations that directed dispute-resolution entities to begin with the presumption that the offer closest to the qualifying payment amount was the appropriate out-of-network payment.

The final rules also:

- Discuss situations in which payers have a down-coded claim.
- Establish new requirements about what information payers must share with providers if a claim is down-coded.
- Provide an <u>FAQ</u> and <u>status report</u> for the independent dispute-resolution process.

IHA is reviewing the final regulations and will update members with any concerns.

IHA to host MidAmerican Information Summit

The IHA Information Center staff will host the annual MidAmerica Information Summit Sept. 7-9, at the IHA Conference Center in Des Moines. The event is a national conference for state hospital association data professionals. Nearly 70 data professionals from 32 state and regional hospital associations will attend.

The summit is an opportunity for data leaders nationwide to learn from their peers and hear from experts about topics aimed at improving hospital and patient data use. The agenda includes presentations about:

- American Hospital Association's data programs, data analytics and visualization resources.
- Association data initiatives.
- · Quality and patient safety.
- · Social determinants of health.

The summit helps IHA staff identify information services that can be developed for IHA member use. Members are provided opportunities to share input about information development through the Council on Health Information and other groups and committees.

Additionally, the summit helps IHA identify data partnership opportunities with peer state hospital associations. To date, 16 state hospital associations have entered into agreements with IHA to implement data programs.

State anticipates bivalent COVID-19 vaccine rollout

The Iowa Department of Health and Human Services is <u>preparing for the potential</u> federal rollout of bivalent COVID-19 booster dose vaccines.

The Food and Drug Administration's Vaccines and Related Biological Products Advisory Committee voted in favor of changing the strain composition of COVID-19 vaccines to include a SARS-CoV-2 omicron component. Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna have both developed bivalent omicron-adapted mRNA vaccines, and it's anticipated the vaccines will be authorized only as a single dose in people who have completed a primary COVID-19 vaccine series.

In anticipation of federal approval, Iowa HHS sent an additional vaccine allocation survey Wednesday, Aug. 17, for only bivalent COVID-19 vaccines. During the anticipated initial rollout of the bivalent vaccines, minimum order quantities will be:

- + 100 a000 moromonio foi modorna vaccinco.
- 300-dose increments for Pfizer-BioNTech vaccines.

After the initial rollout, the state will receive ongoing vaccine allocations to support bivalent booster vaccination.
