In submitted comments to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, <u>IHA</u>

proadily supported UNIS proposals to reduce regulatory parriers and reporting requirements and provided additional comments about:

- 340B drug payment policy.
- Hospital quality star rating.

### LeaderPass is your one-stop shop for Annual Meeting materials

The 2022 IHA Annual Meeting is in person this year and attendees will recognize LeaderPass from the last two years. IHA is again using the LeaderPass platform as the source for presentation materials, agendas, evaluations and speaker bios.

After registering for the Annual Meeting, participants can view the 2022 materials in their LeaderPass dashboard. Previous virtual annual meetings participants can log in to access their passes. New users must register a free user account. When the account is confirmed, participants can access their passes.

Here are some helpful tips for using LeaderPass:

- Use Chrome, Edge or Firefox as your browser. Safari and Explorer do not work as well.
- Switch to an incognito window.
- If you cannot connect to LeaderPass, try using another device or Wi-Fi network to access LeaderPass.
- If you still have trouble, it is likely a firewall issue, particularly if you are
  accessing it at work or on a company device. If you believe this is the issue,
  contact your IT department and have them whitelist https://leaderpass.com/.
- If you've logged in and don't see your pass, log out and log in again.
- Register for LeaderPass with the same email address you used to register for the 2022 Annual Meeting.
- If you have a LeaderPass account, ensure you are logging on to the existing account page and not the new-user page.

MOILY SMITH, group VICE president for public policy with AHA, and Travis Gentry, cochief executive officer at Hy-Vee Health, will demonstrate how Vitality Index tracks payer-specific revenue cycle measures using de-identified claims data. Vitality index also can help identify opportunities to reduce operation challenges.

# Unpatched and outdated medical device concerns for cybersecurity experts

The Federal Bureau of Investigation <u>identified an increasing number of vulnerabilities</u> <u>posed by unpatched medical devices</u> running on outdated software and lacking adequate security features.

Cyberthreat actors exploiting medical device vulnerabilities adversely affect health care facilities' operation functions, patient safety, data confidentiality and data integrity. Medical device vulnerabilities predominantly stem from device hardware design and device software management.

Routine challenges include:

- Inability to upgrade security features.
- Including a large number of devices on a network.
- Lack of device-embedded security features.
- Using standardized configurations or specialized configurations.

The FBI recommends health organizations secure medical devices, identify vulnerabilities and increase employee awareness reporting. Contact your local FBI Cyber Squad with questions.
