Blessing Health Keokuk closure highlights importance of REH

Blessing Health System announced it will shutter the doors of Blessing Health Keokuk at 12:01 a.m. Saturday, Oct. 1. Kathy Hull, chief of small rural hospitals for Blessing Health, said the hospital has been in a financial crisis for 10 years. Hull said decayed infrastructure, current and expected patient use of hospital-based services in Keokuk and financial concerns in rural health settings contributed to the decision.

Blessing Health Keokuk employes 147 staff and the health system said it will work to transfer as many as possible to other Blessing facilities. Keokuk residents will need to travel for care or wait for local urgent care facilities to open.

"Our hospitals, especially in rural settings, provide vital, quality care to the communities they serve," said IHA President and CEO Chris Mitchell. "It's critical to advocate for policies that will preserve local access to health care for all lowans by preventing additional closures of rural hospitals. IHA and member hospitals worked to pass the rural emergency hospital designation so we can see better outcomes in rural communities hit hard by workforce shortages and financial hardship."

The rural emergency hospital designation allows hospitals with fewer than 50 beds to continue operating with outpatient and emergency services only. IHA advocated for the new designation and is providing feedback to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services about the conditions of participation and regulations for payment.

IHA Board Nominee Matt Wenzel - President/CEO Great River Health, West Burlington

Matt Wenzel has been president and CEO of Great River Health in West Burlington since January 2018.

Wenzel was with Kansas City-based Saint Luke's Health System for a decade before joining Great River Health as president and CEO. He also was marketing manager of physician solutions at Cerner before his appointment to Saint Luke's Health System.

Wenzel holds masters' degrees in health administration and health care informatics from the University of Missouri in Columbia.

Swinging for Scholars raises \$129,000

Thursday's 15th annual Swinging for Scholars event, Thursday, Sept. 1, was a success with more than \$129,000 raised. The funds will help lowans as they pursue their health care degrees and higher education in their health care-related fields. More than 200 attendess, 156 golfers and 30 sponsors came together at the Tournament Club of lowa in Polk City.

More than \$2 million in health care career scholarships have been awarded to lowans since the IHERF Health Care Careers Scholarship Fund was created 17 years ago. The day's attendees celebrated this years scholarship recipients. Scholarships awarded this year totaled \$207,500.

IHERF awards scholarships of up to \$7,000 (\$3,500 per year for a maximum of two years) or \$1,000 per year for EMS certification to lowans enrolled in an accredited program leading to licensure or a clinical laboratory degree. Recipients must commit to working one year in an lowa hospital for each year of scholarship award.

Workforce main topic at IHA statewide meeting

Beth Townsend, director of Iowa Workforce Development, highlighted the many programs the state has implemented to boost Iowa's workforce. During the 2022 IHA All-Districts Meeting Wednesday, Aug. 31, Townsend said the state is expanding several training programs and adding resources to the department.

lowa Workforce Development said the state is finding solutions to expand work-based learning, like the lowa Registered Apprenticeship Program. Townsend said the department is working through licensure issues for the 11 health care tracts in the program and encouraged hospitals to engage.

She also said lowa Workforce Development is creating the Business Engagement Division. The new division will be a one-stop shop for employees by putting them in contact with potential employees and connecting them with resources.
